COMPLIANCE WITH THE MODERN SLAVERY ACT 2015

PRESENTED BY THE DIRECTOR OF CORPORATE AFFAIRS

1. Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement

- 1.1. The Modern Slavery Act 2015 (the 'Act') was passed by Parliament in March 2015 and came into effect in October 2015. The Act is aimed at combating crimes of slavery and human trafficking. It recognises that businesses have a role to play in tackling these crimes.
- 1.2. Section 54 of the Act requires commercial organisations, having a global turnover above £36 million, to publish an annual slavery and human trafficking statement for each financial year.
- 1.3. The statement must be published on the Trust's website and include a link to the statement in a prominent place on the website's home page.
- 1.4. The Trust's annual turnover has been updated to include the current figure for 2017/18 subject to the completion of the annual accounts.

2. Recommendation

The Board of Directors are asked to consider, and if thought fit, approve the Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement, subject to audit.
